Project Description

Public key cryptosystems are encryption systems that allow us to communicate securely without any prior secret key exchange. They now play critical roles in our modern communication systems such as the Internet. Multivariate and lattice public key cryptosystems are new systems being developed to be able to resist future quantum computer attacks and perform much more efficiently. The theoretical foundation of these systems is the theory of functions over finite fields and theory of lattices. In this project, a student will work in our research group in the Mathematical Sciences Department at UC. The work will consist of first studying the theoretical algorithm in multivariate and lattice public key cryptosystems, then implementing the cryptosystem and testing its efficiency and security. A student should have some background in basic abstract algebra theory, linear algebra and some programming experience. The student would participate in research discussion sessions of our research group.
